

- Around the Jackson Square are normally a variety of tarot readers, street musicians and entertainers, and artists peddling their work. Taking this in is another way to enjoy a warm afternoon or to simply rest before continuing with your walking tour.



- On the weekends many of the streets around the French Quarter are filled with street entertainment from banjo playing to magicians to do wop groups.

- On one corner of Jackson Square lies the Café Du Monde. Almost all they serve there are beignets and chicory Cafe Au Lait. You simply don't go to the French Quarter and not stop at world famous Du Monde to get some powdered sugar on yourself.

- Beignets are French doughnuts that look like little pillows which are buried under a load of powdered sugar. Chicory Cafe Au Lait has a distinctive flavor and is the local tradition. They're open 24/7 and are always busy.
